FIREARMS SEIZED DURING SEPARATE COMPLIANCE HOME CHECKS

Sacramento, CA – On May 14, 2018, the Sacramento County Probation Department seized two firearms and ammunition while conducting monthly home compliance checks of subjects on probation.

At approximately 1:25 pm, a 19 year old, male with probation status from a prior juvenile case was arrested at his home in the 4800 block of Propitious Court in Sacramento. Probation Officers stopped by the subject's home to ensure he was in compliance with specific court orders. During the course of a probation search of his room, officers discovered a firearm and ammunition within the subject's backpack. Officers arrested the subject on fresh charges of Felon in Possession of Ammunition and Prohibited from Possessing a Firearm, and placed a juvenile hold on him. The subject was arrested and booked into county jail.

Approximately 30 minutes later, probation officers in the area of Grand Avenue in Sacramento arrested two subjects in possession of an unregistered firearm and ammunition during a separate probation home compliance check. Officers arrested William Goins, age 29, a validated gang member on Post Release Community Supervision, and Daniel Amadeo Lucero, age 28, after recovering the weapon, wrapped in a red bandana, in a vehicle during a compliance search. Both Goins and Lucero were arrested for two felony counts of firearm related charges and booked into the county jail.

"We want to catch any felon in possession of a firearm before they use it. The importance of going out into the community and checking on subjects in their homes is vital to offender accountability. Removing illegal weapons from the hands of felons immediately eliminates a terrible risk to our community and will have an impact on crime reduction within Sacramento County," stated the Chief Deputy of Adult Community Corrections Jim Sanders.

Each of these subjects is scheduled for arraignment on May 16. Photos attached (4)
