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PURPOSE OF THE COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PARTNERSHIP (CCP)

- Established by legislation as the body responsible for developing the plan (AB 109 Plan) that advises the Board of Supervisors on specific programming needs to implement provisions of AB 109 public safety realignment legislation
 - Public safety realignment legislation was enacted to reduce the number of state prison inmates. It shifted responsibility for specified lower level (non-serious, non-violent, non-sex offender) offender populations from the state to counties.

COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PARTNERSHIP MEMBERS

- Penal Code § 1230 specifies CCP members

The local Community Corrections Partnership shall be chaired by the chief probation officer and comprised of the following membership:

- (A) The presiding judge of the superior court, or his or her designee.
- (B) A county supervisor or the chief administrative officer for the county.
- (C) The district attorney.
- (D) The public defender.
- (E) The sheriff.
- (F) A chief of police.
- (G) The head of the county department of social services.
- (H) The head of the county department of mental health.
- (I) The head of the county department of employment.
- (J) The head of the county alcohol and substance abuse programs.
- (K) The head of the county office of education.
- (L) A representative from a community-based organization with experience in successfully providing rehabilitative services to persons who have been convicted of a criminal offense.
- (M) An individual who represents the interests of victims.

COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PARTNERSHIP MEMBERS

- The CCP has a Full Committee and Executive Committee
 - Both are chaired by the Chief Probation Officer
 - The Executive Committee has voting authority and is comprised of the Chief Probation Officer (Chair), Chief of Police, Sheriff, District Attorney, Public Defender, Presiding Judge of the Superior Court (or his/her designee), a representative from either the County Department of Social Services, Mental Health, or Alcohol and Substance Abuse Programs, as appointed by the County Board of Supervisors

AB 109 PUBLIC SAFETY REALIGNMENT PLAN (AB 109 PLAN)

- The AB 109 Plan is a report that advises the Board of Supervisors on specific programming needed to implement the provisions of public safety realignment legislation
- The CCP Executive Committee votes on the AB 109 Plan
- The CCP recommends the local AB 109 Plan to the county Board of Supervisors
- The AB 109 Plan is deemed accepted by the Board of Supervisors unless it is rejected by a vote of four-fifths of the board, in which case the AB 109 Plan goes back to the CCP for further consideration

AB 109 PUBLIC SAFETY REALIGNMENT FUNDING

- AB 109 provides a dedicated and permanent revenue stream to the counties through Vehicle License Fees and a portion of the State sales tax
- The CCP does NOT make realignment funding decisions
- The CCP can only identify what is needed to implement provisions of realignment legislation through the AB 109 Plan submitted to the Board of Supervisors
- Board of Supervisors decides the distribution of realignment funds allocated to the County through the annual budget process

COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PARTNERSHIP MEMBER VACANCY

- The CCP has a member vacancy for a representative from a community-based organization with experience in successfully providing rehabilitative services to persons who have been convicted of a criminal offense
- Please submit an application by 5:00 pm on January 27, 2021 if you would like to be considered for this member position
 - The vacant member appointment will be made by the Board of Supervisors

COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PARTNERSHIP ADVISORY WORKGROUP

- The CCP Advisory Workgroup replaces the Statistical Working Group to provide recommendations to the CCP regarding additional AB 109 Plan updates
- CCP Advisory Workgroup includes local agency stakeholder and community representatives
- CCP Advisory Workgroup community members will be selected from applications due by 5:00 pm on January 27, 2021
 - Preference will be given to people with lived experience from being formerly incarcerated.
