



PUBLIC INPUT SOUGHT ON LOCAL PUBLIC SAFETY REALIGNMENT PLAN

THE SACRAMENTO COUNTY COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PARTNERSHIP REQUESTS INPUT ON PLAN GAPS AND PRIORITIES

The Sacramento County Community Corrections Partnership (CCP), comprised of the County Probation Chief (chair), Sheriff, District Attorney, Public Defender, Chief Deputy of Social Services, Director of Alcohol and Drug/Mental Health, Board of Supervisor/County Executive member, a Chief of Police, Superior Court Executive Officer, Employment member, Education member, Victim Representative member and Community Based Organization member was established in May 2011 to implement public safety realignment.

Public safety realignment (Assembly Bill 109 and 117, as amended) went into effect October 1, 2011 effectively shifting responsibility for managing offenders from the State to Counties. Non-violent, non-serious and non-sex offenders are no longer sentenced to prison. Instead, they now serve time in the local jail, on probation or with alternative custody options. Furthermore, offenders released from prison that have a current non-violent, non-serious conviction, or are a low to moderate risk sex offender, will be sent to counties for local supervision. The CCP, by statute, is responsible for developing a Realignment Plan to describe how this new population of offenders will be addressed in Sacramento County.

The CCP is holding a public hearing to gather input from community and faith-based organizations, substance abuse and mental health treatment providers, education and training providers, businesses, advisory boards and the public to identify priorities and gaps in the local public safety realignment plan. The County expects to have \$34.9M - \$37.8M in FY 2013-14 dedicated to this program and has preliminarily allocated \$28M to currently-funded programs in accordance with the Public Safety Realignment Plan. The CCP has identified some gaps in programs and services including but not limited to: program and services research and evaluation; data collection; mental health and substance abuse treatment and services; cognitive behavior therapy; housing; transportation; employment; psychotropic medication and monitoring; supervision; alternative custody programs; and inmate services.

The CCP is seeking public input on whether the identified gaps are correct and assistance with establishing priorities to help shape their recommendation to the Board of Supervisors on funding during the September 2013 budget hearings. **No funding proposals will be accepted or heard at this meeting;** it is for public input and education of the CCP only. Public input is requested in the following areas:

- Has the CCP identified the correct gaps?
- Should other gaps be added?
- What priority should be given to the identified gaps?

The public meeting is scheduled for Thursday, June 6, 2013 from 8:30 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.(noon) in the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors Chamber, 700 H Street, 1st floor. There will be a time limit of 3 minutes per speaker.
