# **Youth Detention Facility OPERATIONS ORDER**

## LEGAL MATERIALS

### **Purpose and Scope**

An attorney may never disclose or permit to be disclosed to a defendant, members of the defendant's family, or anyone else, the address or telephone number of a victim or witness whose name is disclosed to the attorney. (California Penal Code 1054.2 (a) (1))

Legal materials given to a youth by counsel are confidential in so far as they do not compromise the safety and security of the facility or violate Section 1054.1 of the California Penal Code.

#### I. Guidelines

- 1. All legal materials, including but not limited to Police Reports, Presentence Reports and Minute Orders will be "sanitized" by counsel before reviewing with a youth or releasing to a youth, youth's parent /quardian, or a probation staff. All addresses and phone numbers of victims and witnesses will be obliterated. (California Penal Code 1054.2)
- 2. Probation Staff will conduct a cursory review of all legal documents to ensure the document has been "sanitized" before releasing it to a youth.
  - A. If probation staff discover the document has not been "sanitized", the staff will contact the Duty Supervisor immediately.

- B. The document will not be released to the youth until cleared by the Duty Supervisor.
- 3. Legal materials will be placed in an envelope marked with the youth's name and designated CONFIDENTIAL.
- 4. The envelope will be kept in a secure area, in each unit, in a manner consistent with the maintenance of confidentiality.
- 5. The youth will be allowed to examine these materials at their request or at the request of counsel during reasonable periods.
- 6. The youth will examine these materials <u>only</u> in privacy. Legal materials are not to be subject to scrutiny by others.
